



Confusion on Definitions & Guidelines



Capacity of assessors and companies

Variation in capacity causes challenges

- Following required procedures
- Defending decisions
- Quality of reporting & mapping
- Implementing M&M recommendations
- Passing an audit



Capacity of assessors and companies

Potential solutions to capacity problems

- Tighten RSPO approval process
- Team leader responsible for report
- Mandatory well structured training for assessors & companies
- Mandatory independent peer review
- Required Code of Conduct



Confidentiality & Credibility: Trade-off?

Lack of public reporting in HCV means...

- Basic information not available
- Poor quality goes undetected
- Limited data or knowledge sharing
- Credibility is questioned by public



Conclusions

- HCV is the right tool for RSPO
- But 'blazing new trails' with inadequate rules and support structures
- Clarity needed concerning role of HCV vis-à-vis other safeguards within RSPO
- Increase guidance
- Increase capacity & transparency
